2009 Wow What a Season

As I sit here and write this article, the softball season is winding down. Playoffs have begun and the State Tournament is in sight for some teams. To some it is the sign that the end of the school year is very near. To others this is the time to keep pushing and reach that ultimate goal. Personally, now that I have the time to reflect on the season, I can say that without a doubt this has been the most difficult season in regards to scheduling, but it has also been one of the best years for our sport in regard to levels of competition. This has been a year in which many coaches have commented to me that the level of competition is evening out in all classifications across the state.

One of the many obstacles that we had to endure this spring was TAKS testing. This year we had TAKS testing the same week as the Softball Bi-District Playoff certification. Tests were administered Tuesday through Friday of that week. We all know how difficult it is to practice more than a couple of days in a row. These kids want to play games not practice. How do you keep them focused practicing 4 days without a game?

Another conflict that always arises in the spring is with our multi-sport athletes. The softball playoffs and regional and state track meets always throw a wrench into the playoff scheduling. To me, this is a no brainer. If an athlete has qualified for regional or state track, and her softball team is still in the playoffs, the opponent should try to work with that school allowing that athlete to compete in both softball playoffs and regional and state track. As a coach I think it is a disservice to our profession to make our elite athletes choose. Let them shine in both sports if at all possible.

One of the biggest dates in a high school girl's life is Senior Prom. Every school has one so all of us have to deal with it. Even if your season happens to be over before Prom, the girls will, and do, talk about it during practice. Again, how do you keep the girls focused during practice? During games? And, what do you do if your school's prom is Friday night during a playoff round and the coach of the other team is wanting to play Friday night? I know that sometimes we have to make tough choices

in life, but please try to be considerate. It's not only a big day for your seniors, in some cases it can be a financial loss for the family when you consider the cost of the dress, limo, etc.

As I wrote all of the above, we just recently had another issue throw us a major curve ball. The Swine Flu came into our lives. Because of this the UIL had to put a hold on all activities. Two weeks without playing a game. This meant lots of practice time. Again, how do you keep the players focused for a game that is two weeks away? Rescheduling games. Searching for umpires, sites, etc. Then having to scramble all again because the ban on playing was lifted early. I am thankful that the H1N1 virus doesn't seem to be as bad as it first was thought but it sure did make a lot of coaches grow a few extra gray hairs.

All in all it has been a season to remember. Not just for the bad things that came our way but because of the good things as well. Our sport has come a long way in a

Today, sixteen years later, we now crown a State Champion in all classifications, and, the gap in the level of competition between the teams in each classification seems to be shrinking. The teams that were once considered the bottom-dwellers are starting to win ball games. Unranked teams are beating ranked teams. Lower classification schools are beating 4A and 5A schools. Pitching is still the key com-

ponent to this sport, but the hitters are really getting better. I love what I am seeing from the players, but most important, I love what I am seeing from the coaches. We have had our fair share and then some of obstacles or distractions to overcome. Oh yeah, and I haven't even mentioned the weather issues we face. Given all of this, you didn't gripe. You just rolled with the punches and kept moving forward., looking forward to the next game, forward to be able to keep working with your teams to make them better every day. Good Luck to everyone still in the playoffs and to everyone else, keep working hard. Your kids deserve it.
