UIL RULE CHANGES

2011 - 2012



Football

- Allow scrimmages after six days of contact (rather than seven).

Baseball and Softball

- Allow three games to be substituted in place of tournament in high school baseball and softball.



Golf

- Allow all players to participate in the team playoff in golf.

UIL RULE CHANGES

2011 - 2012



GENERAL

- Change the UIL Concussion Management Protocol to that of the National Federation of State High School Associations based upon the recommendation of the UIL Medical Advisory Committee.
- Providing for specific exceptions to the UIL rule that prohibits schools from allowing students to enroll in more than one Physical Education and/or athletic class (see Section 1206(e)).
- Changes to Reclassification and Realignment Policies regarding students with multiple disabilities and the ability of schools to “opt up”.

UIL RULE CHANGES 2011 - 2012



SOCCER

- Allow schools to have their first soccer scrimmage after the five-day holiday restriction in December.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

- Remove the degree of difficulty requirement for girls and boys in diving.

NFHS RULE CHANGES 2011-2012

- 2-8-5; CENTER CIRCLE LINE SPECIFICATIONS (1-3-1): The center restraining circle specifications were changed to permit a minimum of a $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch-wide single line but a line no wider than 2-inches to designate the outer edge of the circle. Many existing courts already have a center circle that has a single $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch line. A mathematical line between two solid colors is still permitted. The committee believes this change will provide consistency in the rule.

ARM COMPRESSION SLEEVE REQUIREMENTS

(3-5-3): The specifications regarding arm compression sleeves were changed to require the item to be white, black, beige or a single solid school color. The sleeve must also be the same color for each team member and have only a single manufacturer's logo that does not exceed 2 • square inches. Arm compression sleeves must still be worn for medical purposes.

NFHS Rule changes con't

- **TEAM CONTROL DURING A THROW-IN (4-12-1, 2, 6):** Several definitions were changed to reflect that team control will now exist during a throw-in when the thrower-in has the ball at his/her disposal. The change primarily affects how foul penalties will be administered. By changing the definition of player and team control to include a throw-in, greater consistency in penalty administration for a common foul is achieved. Under the previous rule, because there was no team control during a throw-in, the penalty for a common foul committed by the throw-in team after the throw-in had begun resulted in free throws if the offended team was in the bonus, which was inconsistent with the penalty for a team-control foul in non-throw-in situations. administering free throws.

Game Regulations

- **21 games, 3 tournaments**
- **If District champion has a bye for the first round they may play a warm-up game in addition to game limit**
- **(non-school night, no loss of school time)**
- **Other play-off bound teams must have a game to give in order to schedule a warm-up game before 1st play-off game**
- **2 games may be substituted in place of a tournament, a total of 27 games may be played if no tournaments**

Game Regulations

- **District VARSITY games postponed by weather or public disaster shall be rescheduled on the next available date (played as an exception to school week limitation)**
- **Holiday restriction- a school shall not conduct contests or practices during 5 consecutive days of December to include December 24, 25, 26**
- **Tiebreaker procedures not clearly defined by district rules at beginning of season will default to UIL tiebreaker rules**
- **No team shall participate in more than two games per day, including tournaments**

STUDENT'S ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL UIL CONTESTS

Student's Eligibility:

- Is not a high school graduate
- Is a full-time student (4 hours per day)
- Regular attendance / 15 day rule
- Meets credit requirements (“NO PASS NO PLAY”)
- Enrolled in four year program
- Four year rule (clock starts in 9th, consecutive)
- Age Rule
- Was not recruited (PAPF) (Varsity only)
- Parent Residence-resides in attendance zone (Varsity only)
- Meets Amateur Status
- Meets requirements of C&CR Section 440 & 400

STUDENT'S ELIGIBILITY

Recruiting:

- Recruiting is not only a violation by the student who has been recruited, but it is also a violation by the school and/or the school district personnel who recruited the student. It is a violation to recruit at all grade levels.

Awards Rule:

- *Awards Schools May Give*

- an award not exceed \$70 in value to a student during that student's high school enrollment at the same school for participation in UIL inter-school competition.

- *Awards Students May Receive*

- A certificate, medal, trophy or other symbolic award for participating in any UIL activity which counts on League standing, if it is given by the school, school district, the district executive committee, or the entity that organized the competition.

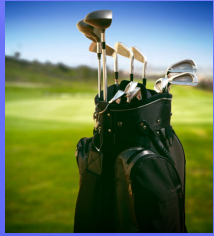


Changing schools for athletic purposes:

- All new students in grades 9-12 who have ever practiced (before, during or after school) or participated in any UIL athletic activity in grade 8-12 at another school **MUST** have this form completed by the previous school (last school of participation) and be approved by the District Executive Committee **before** they are eligible to participate at the varsity level at the new school.
- The new form includes the student eligibility questionnaire that must be completed first for any student new to that school district before participation.

AMATEUR ATHLETIC STATUS

Amateur Rule

Student-athletes in grades 9-12 shall not:

- Accept any valuable consideration as an award for winning/placing in an athletic contest. Valuable consideration is defined as anything wearable, usable or salable, and includes such items as tee-shirts, hamburger coupons, free or reduced rate tennis racquets, etc.
- Accept valuable consideration for teaching or coaching any UIL sport, except beginning swimming or lifesaving lessons.
- Accept valuable consideration for allowing their name to be used for advertisement of a product, plan or service.

AMATEUR ATHLETIC STATUS

Amateur Rule

VALUABLE CONSIDERATION SCHOOL TEAMS AND ATHLETES MAY ACCEPT:

- **Pre-Season.** School athletic teams may be given pre-season meals, if approved by the school.
- **Post-Season.** School athletic teams may be given post-season meals if approved by the school. Banquet favors or gifts are considered valuable consideration and are subject to the Awards and Amateur Rules if they are given to a student athlete at any time.
- **Other.** If approved by the school, school athletic teams and athletes may be invited to and may attend functions where free admission is offered, or where refreshments and/or meals are served. Athletes or athletic teams may be recognized at these functions, but may not accept anything, other than food items, that is not given to all other students.

AMATEUR ATHLETIC STATUS

Amateur Rule

- Additional VALUABLE CONSIDERATION THAT SCHOOL TEAMS AND ATHLETES MAY ACCEPT

Examples of additional items deemed allowable under this interpretation if approved by the school, include but are not limited to:

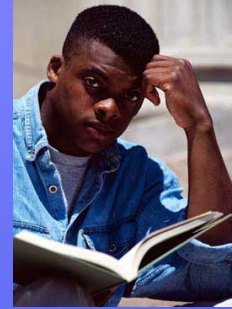
1. meals, snacks or snack foods during or after practices;
2. parties provided by parents or other students strictly for an athletic team

Eligibility for the FIRST Six Weeks (Credit Requirements)::

- *Grades nine and below* - must have been promoted from the previous grade.
- *Second Year of High School* - five accumulated credit towards state graduation.
- **Third Year of High School* - ten accumulated credit toward state graduation.
- **Fourth Year of High School* - fifteen accumulated credits toward state graduation

***If accumulated credits are not earned, must earn 5 credits within previous 12 months**

“NO PASS NO PLAY”

Eligibility for the FIRST Six Weeks (Credit Requirements):

- Students who do not meet the previous requirements are academically ineligible for participation the first six weeks of the school year. Grades are checked at the end of the first six weeks and if the students are passing all classes, they could regain academic eligibility after the seven calendar day grace period.

“NO PASS NO PLAY”



Eligibility AFTER the FIRST Six Weeks:

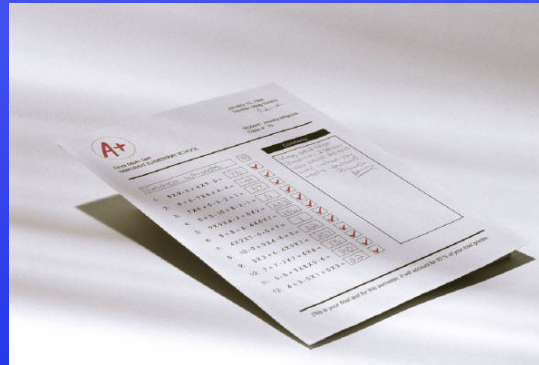
- All schools must check grades for all participants at the end of the first six weeks of the school year. From that point, grades are checked at the end of the grading period whether it is six, nine, or twelve weeks in length.
- Students who pass remain eligible until the end of the next grading period. All activity coaches and directors are responsible for obtaining official grade reports from the individual the principal designates as the keeper of official grades before the student represents the school.
- This provision applies to all grading periods. It also applies to all three school week evaluation periods for ineligible students.

“NO PASS NO PLAY”

Eligibility AFTER the FIRST Six Weeks:

- A student who receives, at the end of any grading period (after the first six weeks of the school year), a grade below 70 in any academic class (other than an identified advanced class) or a student with disabilities who fails to meet the standards in the Individual Education Plan (IEP) may not participate in extracurricular activities for at least three school weeks.

LIMITS ON PRACTICE AND PERFORMANCE

Activities Inside the School Year:

- **School Week Limitation**

- For any given extracurricular activity, a student may not participate in more than one activity per school week, excluding holidays.

- **Eight Hour Rule**

- State law limits schools to no more than eight hours of practice outside of the school day during the school week, per activity. School week is defined as Monday to the end of school on the last instructional day of the week (usually Friday).

LIMITS ON PRACTICE AND PERFORMANCE



Activity Periods:

- Student athletes shall not be enrolled in more than one physical education and/or athletic class whether or not they are receiving credit. **Exceptions: PE Class: Adventure/Outdoor Education; PE Substitutes: JROTC, Cheerleading, Drill Team, Marching Band**

Extracurricular Absences:

- In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Education Code, § 33.0811, the number of times that a school district may allow a student to miss a class for extracurricular participation during a school year shall be determined by the *school district board of trustees*.

School Summer Camps & Clinics Non-School Activities

School Summer Camps & Clinics

(Incoming 7th -9th Student-athletes from coaches own attendance zone)

Camp guidelines:

- Offered the last day of school, and before 2nd Monday in August
- 6 consecutive days
- Fee waiver process for students unable to pay
- May use equipment inherent to the sport

Coaches are prohibited from:

- Using incoming 10th-12th grade students
- Paying fees

Non-School Activities

(7-12 Student-athletes from coaches own attendance zone)

Coaches can assist in:

- Organization, selection of players, and selection of coaches for a league
- Supervision of facilities
- Instruct his or her own adopted or birth children

Coaches are prohibited from:

- Giving instruction
- Being primary coordinator point of contact, or director
- Transporting students
- Using school funds
- Using school equipment
- Handling money
- Paying any type of fees

Recommend coaches do not:

- Officiate while students are participating

- An individual may participate in League competition or contests as a representative of the participant school he/she attends if that student has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education, and is passing the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education.

C&CR Section 1400

Junior High Student's Eligibility

- Junior high students are not prohibited from competing at a grade level higher than the one in which they are enrolled.
- To participate in athletic competition, a student who initially entered the seventh or eighth grade during the current school year and has a special needs condition which delayed his or her education by at least one year, and students who are overage due to limited English proficiency, and who have substantiation from a language proficiency assessment committee, may petition the UIL to participate at grade level.

Junior High Athletic Eligibility

ELIGIBILITY FOR ATHLETIC CONTESTS:

- Meets all requirements of Section 1400
- For seventh grade athletic competition, has not reached his/her 14th birthday on or before September 1, and has not enrolled in the ninth grade.
- For eighth grade athletic competition, has not reached his/her 15th birthday on or before September 1, and has not enrolled in the ninth grade.

Junior High Athletic Eligibility



- A student who initially entered the seventh or eighth grade the current school year and is too old for seventh or eighth grade participation may participate according to age, that is, seventh graders on the eighth grade, ninth grade, high school junior varsity or high school varsity team, and eighth graders on the ninth grade, high school junior varsity, or high school varsity team.
- Is a full-time student in grade seven or eight at the school he/she represents.

- Has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education
- Has not repeated the seventh or eighth grade for athletic purposes.

Junior High Athletic Eligibility



SIXTH GRADE PARTICIPATION:

- No interscholastic athletic competition below seventh grade.
- Student's Eligibility. A sixth grader may participate in League competition or contests as a representative of a participant school only if he/she:
 - Is a student with a disability which delayed his or her education by at least a year and therefore will be too old to participate the following year as a seventh grader.
 - Has met the requirements of Section 1400
 - Has met the requirements of Section 1478

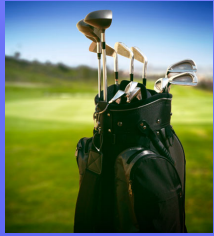

AMATEUR ATHLETIC STATUS



Junior High

- There is no amateur rule for students competing in elementary school or junior high school competitions. Section 441, Amateur Athletic Status, does not apply to students until the first class day of their ninth grade year.

Awards Rule:

- A participant school may not give and a student may not accept awards for participation in interschool competition in excess of \$10 per year (total for all UIL school activities). Certificates awarded by the school, school district, or district executive committee to recognize participating students do not count against the \$10 limit.

PREVIOUS ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION FORM (PAPF)



Changing schools for athletic purposes: DOES NOT APPLY AT THE JUNIOR HIGH LEVEL

- All new students in grades 9-12 who have ever practiced (before, during or after school) or participated in any UIL athletic activity in grade 8-12 at another school **MUST** have this form completed by the previous school (last school of participation) and be approved by the District Executive Committee **before** they are eligible to participate at the varsity level at the new school.

The new form includes the student eligibility questionnaire must be completed first for any student new to that school district before participation.



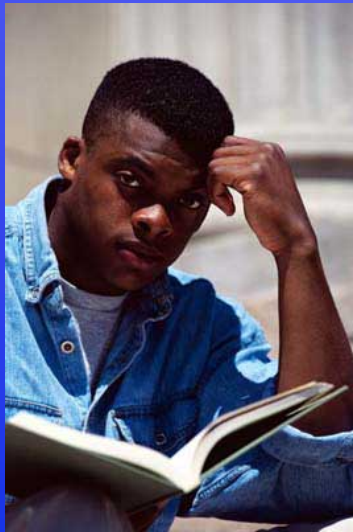

LIMITS ON PRACTICE AND PERFORMANCE



Activity Periods:

- A school district must limit a student to one period of practice during the regularly scheduled school day for extracurricular activities, such as athletics, or drill team, or cheerleading.

Extracurricular Absences:

- In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Education Code, §33.0811, the number of times that a school district may allow a student to miss a class for extracurricular participation during a school year shall be determined by the *school district board of trustees*.

Participation Limitations

Athletic Competitions:

No game, contest, scrimmage, or tournament, including district competition, shall begin prior to the end of the academic school day for all participants.



Calendar Week :

Football - 1 per calendar week, must have 5 days between contests

Other Team Sports - 1 per calendar week plus one tournament

Individual Sports - 1 per calendar week

- Schools shall have **121 consecutive calendar days** to practice outside the school day
