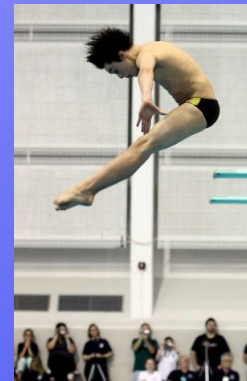

UIL RULE CHANGES 2012 - 2013



GENERAL

- Alter the current UIL Preseason Practice Regulations, activities outside the school year.

CROSS COUNTRY

- Increase the distance of girls' cross-country distance from 2 miles to 3.1 for conferences 4A and 5A.

GOLF

- Increase the golf qualifiers from regionals to state from two teams and two individuals to three teams and three individuals.





UIL RULE CHANGES 2012 - 2013



SOCCER

- Change the end of game tie-breaking procedure from the 35-yard shootout to penalty kicks in soccer.

SWIMMING AND DIVING

- Remove the requirement for schools to submit the official entry forms to the regional and state meets 10 days prior in swimming and diving.

TENNIS



- Allow the school coach to coach players between points in tennis and team tennis.



UIL RULE CHANGES 2012 - 2013

TRACK AND FIELD

- Allow area meets to post-district competition in track and field.
- Remove the restriction for coaches being allowed on the field for the regional and state meets track and field. An area can be designated by the meet administration.



NFHS BASKETBALL RULE CHANGE 2012 - 2013

2-11-12 New

The official scorer is required to wear a black-and-white vertically striped garment.

Rationale: The players, coaches and officials need to be able to quickly and easily



NFHS BASKETBALL RULE CHANGES 2012 - 2013

2012-13 POINTS OF EMPHASIS

1. Closely guarded situations
2. Contact above the shoulders
3. Intentional Fouls
4. Guidelines to enforce illegal contact



BASKETBALL DATES 2012 - 2013

Girls Basketball

October 17	First day for practice
October 27	First day for scrimmages
November 5	First day for games
February 9	District Certification Deadline
Feb 28-Mar 2	State Tournament



UIL Basketball Game and Season Limits 2012 - 2013

- 21 games, 3 tournaments
- 2 games may be substituted in place of a tournament, a total of 27 games may be played if no tournaments.
- Same site same night, a student can play two games (junior varsity and varsity, etc.) in one night but counts as two games towards their season limit and the student is done for the week.



UIL Basketball Regulations 2012 - 2013

- Holiday restriction – a school shall not conduct contests or practices during 5 consecutive days of December. A school may chose any five consecutive days which include December 24, 25, and 26.
- Tiebreaker procedures not clearly defined by district rules at beginning of season will default to UIL tiebreaker rules
- District VARSITY games postponed by weather or public disaster shall be rescheduled on the next available date (played as an exception to school week limitation).

1. “NFHS TEACHING AND MODELING BEHAVIOR” COURSE

- 1.5 hour course/\$20 – minimum penalty for coach ejection

2. “NFHS FUNDAMENTALS OF COACHING” COURSE

- 6 hour course/\$35 – all first year coaches and any coach who is not a full time employee of the school district.

4. Concussion Management – HB2038

- TEC Chapter 38, Sub Chapter D
- The information provided on the Health and Safety section of the UIL web site
- training requirements for coaches, athletic trainers and potential members of a Concussion Oversight Team in the subject matter of concussions, including evaluation, prevention, symptoms, risks, and long-term effects
- UIL has created this Concussion Acknowledgement Form, which is required for all student athletes in grades 7-12
- on the UIL web site is a syllabus that contains an outline of the required elements for the two hour coaches' concussion education training

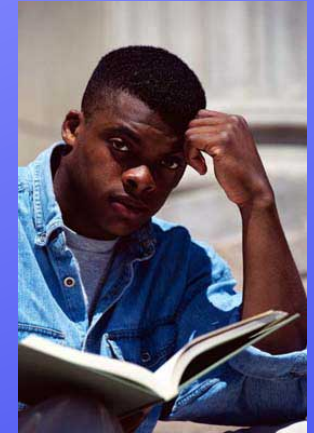

“NO PASS NO PLAY”



Eligibility for the FIRST Six Weeks (Credit Requirements):

- *Grades nine and below - promoted*
- *Second Year of High School- five accumulated credits*
- *Third Year of High School - ten accumulated credits or five credits within the last twelve.*
- *Fourth Year of High School - fifteen accumulated credits or five credits within the last twelve months*





LIMITS ON PRACTICE AND PERFORMANCE



Activities Outside the School Year:

- One practice - no more than three hours.
- More than one practice - no more than five hours total.
- More than one practice - a minimum of two hours of rest/recovery time between practices.
- No consecutive days of multiple practices allowed (exception: Volleyball)

Activities Inside the School Year:

- School Week Limitation
- Eight Hour Rule

STUDENT'S ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL UIL CONTEST



Student's Eligibility:

- Is not a high school graduate
- Is a full-time student (4 hours a day)
- Regular attendance / 15 day rule (Varsity only)
- Meets credit requirements ("NO PASS NO PLAY")
- Enrolled in four year program
- Four year rule (clock starts in 9th grade, consecutive)
- Was not recruited (PAPF-Varsity only)
- Awards Rule
- Meets requirements of C&CR Section 440





C&CR Section 440 VARSITY ELIGIBILITY

ELIGIBILITY FOR ATHLETIC CONTESTS:

- Meets all requirements of Section 400
- Parent Residence (Waiver)
- Age Rule (Waiver)

PREVIOUS ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION FORM (PAPF)

Changing schools for athletic purposes:

- All new students in grades 9-12 who have ever practiced (before, during or after school) or participated in any UIL athletic activity in grade 8-12 at another school **MUST** have this form completed by the previous school (last school of participation) and be approved by the District Executive Committee before they are eligible to participate at the varsity level at the new school.
- A PAPF is not required for subvarsity competition.



PREVIOUS ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION FORM (PAPF)

Changing schools for athletic purposes:

● Common Indicators

- Checking to see if a student was recruited
- Ascertaining whether a student was in good standing in the previous school, either academically or in a sports program
- Determining if a student was unhappy with a coach in the previous school
- Determining if a student played on a non-school team and is transferring to the school where members of the non-school team attend

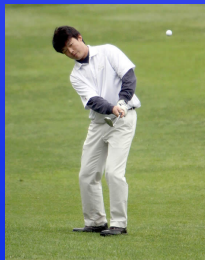


PREVIOUS ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION FORM (PAPF)

Changing schools for athletic purposes:

- **Common Indicators**

- Determining if a student played on a non-school team and is transferring to the school where the non-school team coach, or a relative of the school coach, is the school coach.
- Determining if a student received individual or team instruction from a school coach and is transferring to the school of that coach.

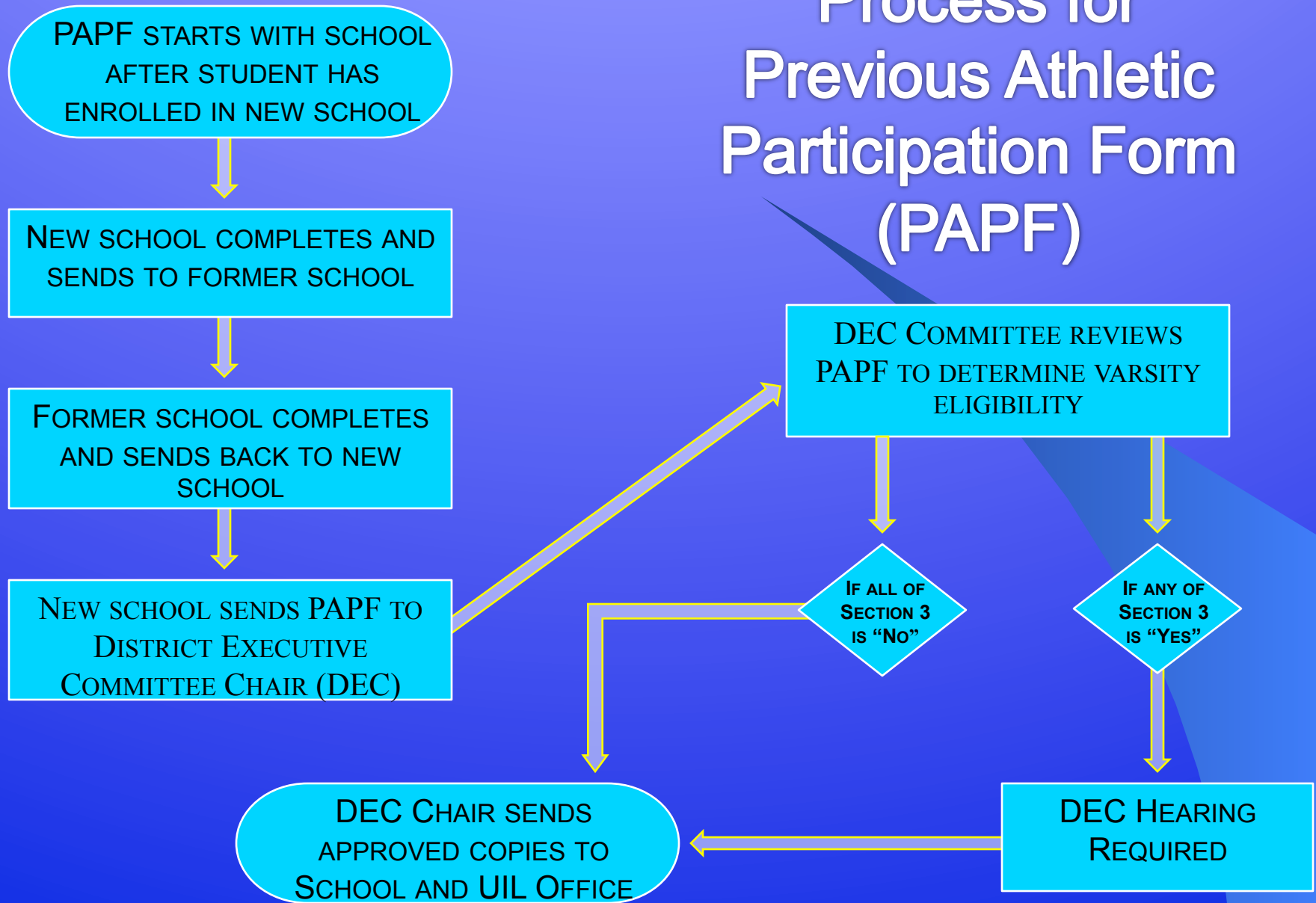

C&CR Section 1400

Junior High Student's Eligibility

- An individual may participate in League competition or contests as a representative of the participant school he/she attends if that student has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education, and is passing the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education.



C&CR Section 1400

Junior High Student's Eligibility

- Junior high students are not prohibited from competing at a grade level higher than the one in which they are enrolled.
- To participate in athletic competition, a student who initially entered the seventh or eighth grade during the current school year and has a special needs condition which delayed his or her education by at least one year, and students who are overage due to limited English proficiency, and who have substantiation from a language proficiency assessment committee, may petition the UIL to participate at grade level.





C&CR Section 1478

Junior High Athletic Eligibility

ELIGIBILITY FOR ATHLETIC CONTESTS:

- Meets all requirements of Section 1400
- For seventh grade athletic competition, has not reached his/her 14th birthday on or before September 1, and has not enrolled in the ninth grade.
- For eighth grade athletic competition, has not reached his/her 15th birthday on or before September 1, and has not enrolled in the ninth grade.



C&CR Section 1478

Junior High Athletic Eligibility



- A student who initially entered the seventh or eighth grade the current school year and is too old for seventh or eighth grade participation may participate according to age, that is, seventh graders on the eighth grade, ninth grade, high school junior varsity or high school varsity team, and eighth graders on the ninth grade, high school junior varsity, or high school varsity team.
- Is a full-time student in grade seven or eight at the school he/she represents.



C&CR Section 1478

Junior High Athletic Eligibility



- Has been in attendance and has passed the number of courses required by state law and by rules of the State Board of Education
- Has not repeated the seventh or eighth grade for athletic purposes.
- Changing schools for athletic purposes





C&CR Section 1478

Junior High Athletic Eligibility

SIXTH GRADE PARTICIPATION:

- No interscholastic athletic competition below seventh grade.
- Student's Eligibility. A sixth grader may participate in League competition or contests as a representative of a participant school only if he/she:
 - Is a student with a disability which delayed his or her education by at least a year and therefore will be too old to participate the following year as a seventh grader.
 - Has met the requirements of Section 1400
 - Has met the requirements of Section 1478





AMATEUR ATHLETIC STATUS



Junior High

- There is no amateur rule for students competing in elementary school or junior high school competitions. Section 441, Amateur Athletic Status, does not apply to students until the first class day of their ninth grade year.

Awards Rule:

- A participant school may not give and a student may not accept awards for participation in interschool competition in excess of \$10 per year (total for all UIL school activities). Certificates awarded by the school, school district, or district executive committee to recognize participating students do not count against the \$10 limit.



Participation Limitations

Athletic Competitions:

No game, contest, scrimmage, or tournament, including district competition, shall begin prior to the end of the academic school day for all participants.



Calendar Week :

Football - 1 per calendar week, must have 5 days between contests

Other Team Sports - 1 per calendar week plus one tournament

Individual Sports - 1 per calendar week





Participation Limitations



BASEBALL AND SOFTBALL

- 12 games and 2 invitational or district tournaments
- Schools shall have **97 consecutive calendar days** to practice outside the school day

BASKETBALL

- 12 games and 2 invitational or district tournaments
- Schools shall have **121 consecutive calendar days** to practice outside the school day



FOOTBALL

- 9 games (but recommend 8)
- From the first day of school, schools shall **have 80 consecutive calendar days** to practice outside the school day





Participation Limitations



SOCCER

- 10 games and 2 invitational or district tournaments
- Schools shall have **86 consecutive calendar days** to practice outside the school day

VOLLEYBALL

- 12 matches and 2 invitational or district tournaments
- Practice shall not begin prior to the first day of school. Schools shall have **86 consecutive calendar days** to practice outside the school day



CROSS COUNTRY, GOLF, SWIMMING, TENNIS, TRACK AND FIELD AND WRESTLING

- **6 meets or tournaments**, including the district meet or tournament
