



UIL ELIGIBILITY: CHEERLEADING

A student is eligible if the student...

- Is a full-time student at the school at which they will participate
- Meets all requirements of Section 400 of the C&CR
- Meets the academic eligibility standards of state law and UIL rules
- Home school students <u>if allowed</u> by the district



ELIGIBILITY: 1ST SIX WEEKS OF SCHOOL YEAR

- Grades nine and below promoted
- Second Year of High School five accumulated credits
- Third Year of High School ten accumulated credits or five credits within the last twelve months
- Fourth Year of High School fifteen accumulated credits or five credits within the last twelve months



UIL SPIRIT

CHEER falls under the **SPIRIT** tab for UIL – What does that mean?

- Cheer/Spirit teams have a set of *guidelines* which are *unique to just them.*
- Also, a few rules that apply to students involved in sports under Athletics Policy, do not apply to cheer/spirit:
 - <u>Parent Residency Rule</u> –The location of a cheerleader's residence <u>DOES NOT</u> impact their eligibility.
 - PAPF newly enrolled students who make the cheer team <u>DO</u>
 <u>NOT</u> need to complete a Previous Participation Form.

UIL REQUIRED STUDENT PARTICIPATION FORMS

- Concussion Acknowledgement Form
- Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness Form
- Check with your local school district policies regarding additional required documentation for students.
 - Physical & Medical History forms are <u>not</u> required by the UIL, but may be required by district policy.


UIL SPIRIT COACHES EDUCATION & TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

- AED & CPR Certification
- **UIL Concussion Education** Two hours every two years
- UIL Coaches Certification Program UIL Portal
 - Safety training for extracurricular activities
 - Spirit Specific module
- Cheer Specific Safety Course (not through UIL)

CCP must be completed by the first practice or start of school, whichever comes first.



SPIRIT PRACTICES & CONTESTS



VERY IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND
THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN

<u>CALENDAR</u> AND <u>SCHOOL</u> WEEK!

School Week – From the first day school is in session for the week until the end of instruction on the last instructional day.

<u>Calendar Week</u> – 12:01 AM Sunday to midnight on Saturday.

SPIRIT PRACTICE REGULATIONS



When School is In-Session

Eight Hour Rule –

- Practice outside the school day is limited to a maximum of <u>eight</u>
 <u>hours per school week</u> per activity
- The in-school cheer period <u>does</u>
 <u>not</u> count towards the allotted 8
 hours

*Practice is unlimited outside the school week.



SPIRITPRACTICE REGULATIONS

When School NOT In-Sessior

- No rules limiting practice during summer
- No rules limiting practice during school holidays

SPIRIT CONTEST REGULATIONS

- Can cheer at <u>one contest during</u> <u>school week</u> and <u>one after the</u> end of the school week.
- Example: Can cheer at volleyball on Tuesday and then again at volleyball on Friday or football on Friday.
- CANNOT cheer at volleyball on Tuesday and football on Thursday.
- Playoffs are an exception to the school week limitation.



2025 SPIRIT STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION I: SCHOOL REPRESENTATION

A. PARTICIPATION AND FEES

The total number of participants for a school team is determined by counting spirit-leading participants including cheerleaders, dancers, and flag runners. Up to two mascots can be added to your routine and must be registered with the team. Mascots <u>will not</u> toward the total number of participants allowed but may impact scoring. The use of live band and/or drum line to supplement the Game Day environment is not permitted.

Schools are responsible for registering their squad in the appropriate division based on conference classification and (when applicable) school enrollment. Each school team will be allowed to enter one (1) school team in the appropriate classification as determined by the school enrollment reported for the 2024-2026 UIL Conference School Alignment. Teams should register by conference classification only. Any division splits will be determined following the close of registration and will be based on the total number of teams in a single conference and school enrollment.

All teams consisting of three (3) or more male <u>cheerleaders</u> will participate in the Coed Division. Only the number of male <u>cheerleaders</u> is considered when determining a coed team. Teams participating in the Coed Division are expected to incorporate male cheerleaders into the execution of cheerleading skills including stunts, jumps, and/or tumbling. Males utilized only for flags or props should be registered as Flag Runners and would not be counted as a Coed participant.

Mascots and Flag Runners are not considered in coed determination, and they cannot be involved in the execution of stunts. Mascots executing any jumps or tumbling must be in accordance with NFHS Spirit rules.

TEAM DIVISIONS:	FEE:
1A – Maximum of 12 participants (2 or fewer male cheerleaders), up to 2 alternates	\$275.00
2A – Maximum of 12 participants (2 or fewer male cheerleaders), up to 2 alternates	\$350.00
3A – Maximum of 20 participants (2 or fewer male cheerleaders), up to 4 alternates	\$425.00
4A – Maximum of 24 participants (2 or fewer male cheerleaders), up to 4 alternates	\$500.00
5A – Maximum of 30 participants (2 or fewer male cheerleaders), up to 6 alternates	\$575.00
6A – Maximum of 30 participants (2 or fewer male cheerleaders), up to 6 alternates	\$625.00
Coed – Maximum of 30 participants (3 or more male cheerleaders), up to 6 alternates	\$625.00

SPIRIT FAQS

"Can you tell me what the UIL try-out requirements are for cheerleading?"

- A: <u>None exist.</u> The try-out process is up to the discretion of the local school / district and coach.
- "Does a new student who transferred to my school need to wait 15 days before they participate?"
 - A: No, cheer does not fall under the transfer rule that athletic teams fall under. As long as a student is enrolled full-time in your school and is academically eligible, they are able to cheer.

SPIRIT FAQS

"My daughter/son was on varsity as a junior, that means they are entitled to be on varsity as a senior, correct?"

 A: Incorrect. A coach can require students to try-out each year to ensure the varsity team is as good as it can possibly be.

"My superintendent did not select 'SPIRIT' on the varsity acceptance form in January. Does that mean we cannot participate in the state spirit contest?"

 A: No. The varsity acceptance form has nothing to do with the State Spirit competition. In order for a team to compete in the state event, they must register using the link that will be on the Spirit State Championship page in September.

SPIRIT FAQS

"Does the school's cheerleading coach/sponsor need to be a full-time employee in order to coach and instruct a cheerleading team or spirit squad?

 A: No. The local school district has the discretion over who will be designated to serve as the cheerleading coach or sponsor.

"Can a school hire a cheer coach and allow them to coach their students in the summer or in a non-school program?

A: Yes. Cheerleading coaches and sponsors will be allowed to instruct the
participants anytime during the school year with local district approval.

During the regular academic school year, a school coach is subject to the
eight hours of practice limitation per school week.

SPIRIT RULE BOOK

The Spirit rules are not UIL rules. UIL Spirit will follow NFHS rules. Be sure to review the NFHS Spirit Rules prior to the school year and to the State Championships.


