## WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

#### **HOMESCHOOL STUDENT PARTICIPATION:**

- All homeschool students are eligible to participate in UIL activities, practices and processes unless their local school district has opted out of the law.
- If the local district has opted out, student would be eligible at nearest school that allows participation to their address.
- School districts that do allow participation can elect to not allow students from other districts to participate.



## WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

#### **NIL:**

- UIL rules now allow student-athletes 17
  years or older to enter into NIL
  agreements with colleges & universities
  while participating in that UIL sport.
- Athletes are still prohibited from entering into NIL agreements with any other entity until exhausting their eligibility in that applicable sport.
- Athletes are still prohibited from promoting a product or service related to their UIL sport.
- Oll rules do not prohibit an athlete from obtaining professional representation.

- 2 coaches verify all eligibility processes

- Factually complete PAPF when sending school
- Appropriate verification of residence (Section 442) & contact previous school



PLAYER EJECTIONS

- Ejected soccer players miss the rest of the game in which they were ejected plus all the following game. Soccer Exception: This does not alter the current point penalty structure for soccer player ejections found in manual.
- Player ejections *cannot* be overturned by a game official and/or chapter.
- If a coach has a question following a contest with a player ejection, the coach should contact UIL.







#### NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION COACHES' REMINDERS

It is important for coaches to have a clear understanding of Section 1201, 1206 and 1209 of the C&CR regarding non-school competition (leagues, camps, clinics, clubs, tournaments). Coaches are prohibited from:

- 1. Coaching students from their attendance zone in grades 7-12. Coaches may not coach seniors in club following the end of their senior season during the remainder of the school year.
- 2.Using school or booster funds to pay for team camps.
- 3.Pressuring athletes to play club soccer or in nonschool leagues. This includes pushing athletes to participate on a specific club team.

NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION

COACHES' REMINDERS

Section 1209 of the C&CR regarding non-school competition (leagues, camps, clinics, clubs, tournaments) allows the following for coaches or a group of coaches:

- 1. Supervise the facility where a club team is practicing or a league is taking place.
- 2.Assist with organization of a league or club team. (assign officials, secure facilities, develop schedules, assist with registration and help secure equipment)
- 3.Assist with the selection of coaches and players for a club team or league.
- 4. Distribute information about leagues and club teams.



COACHES' REMINDERS

UIL CHARITABLE CAUSE GUIDELINES
SCHOOLS MAY HOST A CONTEST IN RECOGNITION OF A
CHARITABLE CAUSE UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- The contest may be held during any one week of the designated sport season as approved by each school.
- NFHS rules allow non-school colors to be worn, UIL required mutual agreement (ex: pink uniforms).
- A commemorative ribbon of non-school color may be worn on the jersey or school-issued uniform.
- Officials may be allowed to use a colored whistle or modified uniform in accordance with UIL guidelines.



### SOCCER RULE BOOK

The soccer playing rules are <u>not</u> UIL rules.

UIL soccer will follow NFHS rules. it is important to review the NFHS soccer Rules prior to the season.





**3-3-1,2,3,2C (NEW):** REMOVES REDUNDANT LANGUAGE AND PERMITS SUBSTITUTIONS DURING A TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED GAME.

RATIONALE: ELIMINATES REDUNDANT LANGUAGE AND ALLOWS SUBSTITUTIONS DURING A TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED GAME. IN HOT WEATHER, STATE ASSOCIATIONS OFTEN AUTHORIZE STOPPAGES WITHIN A HALF FOR WATER BREAKS. UNDER THIS CHANGE, TEAMS WOULD NOW BE PERMITTED TO MAKE SUBSTITUTIONS DURING THESE STOPPAGES.

3-3-2B(2): CLARIFIES THAT AN INJURED PLAYER MUST LEAVE THE FIELD IF THE REFEREE BECKONS A COACH OR APPROPRIATE HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER.

RATIONALE: THE RULES CHANGE CLARIFIES THE CURRENT RULE THAT IF AN OFFICIAL BECKONS A COACH OR APPROPRIATE HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER FOR ANY INJURED PLAYER, INCLUDING THE GOALKEEPER, THAT PLAYER MUST LEAVE THE FIELD REGARDLESS OF THE REASON THE CLOCK IS STOPPED.



4-1-2: CLARIFIES THAT A NUMBER IS REQUIRED ON THE FRONT OF THE JERSEY AND/OR THE SHORTS.

RATIONALE: THIS LANGUAGE SUPPORTS THE RULE PRIOR TO THE REORGANIZATION OF RULE 4 AND ADDS CLARIFICATION TO THE OVERALL INTERPRETATION TO CLARIFY THAT A NUMBER IS REQUIRED ON THE FRONT OF THE UNIFORM WHICH MAY BE ON THE JERSEY AND/OR THE SHORTS.

7-2-4 (NEW): PROHIBITS A COACH OR TEAM PERSONNEL OTHER THAN THE TEAM CAPTAIN FROM SPEAKING WITH A REFEREE DURING INTERVAL BETWEEN PERIODS

RATIONALE: THE TIME BETWEEN PERIODS OF PLAY IS DESIGNATED FOR REST FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS, NOT FOR ENGAGING WITH OFFICIALS. THIS RULE CHANGE INTRODUCES SPECIFIC LANGUAGE AND PENALTIES FOR COACHES WHO CONFRONT OFFICIALS DURING THESE INTERVALS, AIMING TO REDUCE UNNECESSARY DISPUTES AND MAINTAIN A RESPECTFUL GAME ENVIRONMENT.



12-4-4: A MISCONDUCT PENALTY MAY BE GIVEN TO THE HEAD COACH IF TEAM OR BENCH MISCONDUCT OCCURS.

RATIONALE: TO ENCOURAGE AND SUPPORT SPORTING AND POSITIVE BENCH DECORUM, THE RULE CHANGE REINFORCES THE HEAD COACH'S RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CONDUCT OF THEIR TEAM AND BENCH PERSONNEL WITHIN THE TEAM AREA. IT PROVIDES OFFICIALS WITH ADDITIONAL TOOLS, ALLOWING THEM TO WARN, CAUTION, OR EJECT THE HEAD COACH IF ANY BENCH PERSONNEL ENGAGE IN MISCONDUCT.



THEIR CORRESPONDING RULES WHILE EXPANDING THE INDEX TO SERVE AS A QUICK REFERENCE TOOL TO STREAMLINE THE RULES, IMPROVE CLARITY, REMOVE UNNECESSARY DUPLICATION AND ELIMINATE CONFLICTING DEFINITIONS.

RATIONALE: THIS CHANGE RELOCATES DEFINITIONS INTO THEIR CORRESPONDING RULES, STREAMLINING THE RULES BOOK BY REDUCING REDUNDANCIES AND CONTRADICTIONS. THE EXPANDED INDEX AT THE BACK OF THE BOOK CONTINUES TO SERVE AS A HELPFUL QUICK REFERENCE TOOL, WHILE DEFINITIONS WERE UPDATED AND ALIGNED IN CONTEXT WITH APPROPRIATE RULES.

#### MERCY RULE REMINDER

AFTER 20-MINUTES OF PLAY (ELAPSED GAME TIME) IN THE 2<sup>ND</sup> HALF, IF ONE TEAM HAS A GOAL DIFFERENTIAL OF 8+ GOALS, THE GAME WOULD BE STOPPED AND DECLARED FINAL.

# SOCCER REMINDERS practice regulations

IN-SEASON: School is In-Session

#### **Eight Hour Rule**

Practice outside the school day, from the beginning of the school week through the end of the school week (excluding holidays), is limited to a maximum of eight hours per school week per activity

The in-school athletic period does not count towards the allotted 8 hours



# SOCCER REMINDERS practice regulations

IN-SEASON: When School Is Not In Session (HOLIDAY BREAKS)

- 1 Practice Cannot exceed 3 hours
- 2 Practices Cannot exceed 5 hours
  - 3 hours is max for a single practice
  - More than 1 practice scheduled, must have a minimum of 2-hour rest break

Cannot schedule and students may not participate in more than one practice on consecutive days.



# TEAM SPORTS practice regulations

#### OFF-SEASON: School is In-Session

#### **Strength & Conditioning Instruction**

Teams in the off-season are allowed one hour of strength & conditioning instruction outside of the school day.

- Athletes may only attend one, 1-hour session each day, Monday-Friday.
- No skill instruction or equipment is allowed during this hour of S&C instruction.

Skill Instruction is only allowed during the athletic period for offseason team sports.



### SCRIMMAGES

- Soccer teams are limited to one scrimmage during the school week. Schools may also participate in an additional scrimmage at the end of the school week (Friday after school or Saturday).
- Teams are limited to scrimmaging against 3 other schools at the same site on the same day.
- If more than four teams are invited to a scrimmage, each team may only scrimmage three different teams.
- No scrimmages may be played after a team's first interschool game.

- 0 Tournaments and 21 Games or
- 1 Tournament and 19 Games or
- 2 Tournaments and 17 Games or
- 3 Tournaments and 15 Games


Tournaments may be played during a week in which there is another scheduled contest if there is no violation of Texas Education Agency/State Board of Education regulations.

- Number of Teams and Type of Play. A tournament is defined as at least three teams assembled at one site for competition.
- **Scheduling.** Schools shall not schedule tournaments on Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday, unless school is not in session. (See each sport plan for exception to resolve ties for district representatives.) Schools may schedule tournaments on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. A two-day tournament shall not be scheduled on Thursday and Friday. A one day tournament must be scheduled on Saturday.
- or they can play shortened pool play games of 20 minute halves with sudden death for ties. If teams are playing 20-minute halves pool play games, all pool play games combined would count as one of the two allowable games for that day.
- **Site.** A tournament must be held at the ISD of the host school, or at an adjoining ISD. If the tournament does not exceed eight teams, the host school may authorize additional sites for preliminary round games.
- Invitational Tournament Tie Games. In an invitational tournament, the tournament director shall set the tie breaking procedure to be used. This procedure should be explained to the coaches and referees prior to the start of the tournament.

#### DOUBLE HEADER

- A player plays in two games at two levels on the same night (9th & JV, JV & Varsity)
- A double header counts as two games in the calendar week for that athlete.





### DOUBLE HEADER

#### **Example:**

- Athlete plays a double header on Tuesday night, they cannot play again in that calendar week (M-Sa)
- If an athlete plays in a JV game on Tuesday, that player may not play a double header (JV & Varsity game) on Friday. Should an athlete play in 3 matches in a calendar week, the team would be required to forfeit the third game the athlete participated in.
- Exceptions: Thanksgiving week & December/January Holidays
