# WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

#### **HOMESCHOOL STUDENT PARTICIPATION:**

- All homeschool students are eligible to participate in UIL activities, practices and processes unless their local school district has opted out of the law.
- If the local district has opted out, student would be eligible at nearest school that allows participation to their address.
- School districts that do allow participation can elect to not allow students from other districts to participate.



# WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

#### **NIL**:

- UIL rules now allow student-athletes 17 years or older to enter into NIL agreements with colleges & universities while participating in that UIL sport.
- Athletes are still prohibited from entering into NIL agreements with any other entity until exhausting their eligibility in that applicable sport.
- Athletes are still prohibited from promoting a product or service related to their UIL sport.
- UIL rules do not prohibit an athlete from obtaining professional representation.

### PAPFREQUIREMENT

- Factually complete PAPF when sending school
- Appropriate verification of residence (Section 442) & contact previous school

#### Tournaments

A tournament consists of at least three teams assembled at one site for competition.

- Schools shall not schedule tournaments on Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday, unless school is not in session. Schools may schedule tournaments on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.
- Tournaments may be scheduled on non-consecutive days. A two-day tournament shall not be scheduled on Thursday and Friday (can be scheduled on Thursday/Saturday or Friday/Saturday). A one-day tournament <u>must</u> be held on a Saturday.
- Three games per calendar day are allowed in a tournament.
- Max of six games in a tournament.
- A tournament may be played during the week in which there are two matched contests being played (ie. matches on Tuesday/Friday and a tournament on Thursday/Saturday).
- A double round robin elimination tournament shall not be used in any League contest except by unanimous consent of participating schools.
- A tournament must be held at the ISD of the host school, or at an adjoining ISD. Host schools may authorize additional sites other than same or adjoining ISD for preliminary round games.

### NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION COACHES' REMINDERS

Know the UIL Rules regarding non-school competition (leagues, camps, clinics, clubs, tournaments).

Coaches are prohibited from:

- 1. Coaching students from their attendance zone in grades 7-12.
- 2.Using school or booster funds to pay for team camps or leagues.
- 3.Pressuring athletes to play club softball or in non-school leagues. This includes pushing athletes to participate on a specific club team.

NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION COACHES' REMINDERS

WHAT DO THE RULES ALLOW COACHES TO DO?

- 1. Supervise the facility for a club team practice or a league.
- 2.Assist with organization of a league or club team. (assign officials, secure facilities, develop schedules, assist with registration and help secure equipment)
- 3.Assist with the selection of coaches & players for a club team/league.
- 4.Distribute information about leagues & club teams.




# SOFTBALL RULES

The SOFTBALL playing rules are <u>not</u> UIL rules. UIL SOFTBALL will follow <u>NFHS</u> rules.

It is important to obtain/download a copy of and review the NFHS SOFTBALL Rules prior to the season.





### **NFHS SOFTBALL RULE CHANGES**

#### Rule 1-8-6

No player shall transmit or record audio or video from the playing surface. New language further clarifies the use of electronic devices and what is not permitted.

Rationale: This change clearly defines the types of electronic devices prohibited by the rule.



### NFHS SOFTBALL RULE CHANGES

#### Rule 10-4-2

NFHS umpire slacks may either be charcoal gray or navy blue. The heather gray option was stricken from the rules book.

Rationale: Manufacturers have discontinued producing heather gray umpire pants.

#### Rule 8

Reformatted for clarity. Changes have separated longer articles, and organized exceptions, penalties, and effects into outline format for better comprehension.

Rationale: Added article references to PENALTIES and EFFECTS, and Section 4 was separated into two sections addressing runners entitled to advance with and without liability to be put out to delineate differences

- 2. MAINTAINING AN UNOBSTRUCTED VIEW



# SOFTBALL REMINDERS practice regulations

IN-SEASON: When School is NOT in Session (Spring Break)

- 1 Practice Cannot exceed 3 hours
- 2 Practices Cannot exceed 5 hours
  - 3 hours is max for a single practice
  - 2-hour rest break is required if 2 practices are scheduled

Cannot schedule and/or students may not participate in more than one practice on consecutive days.



# SOFTBALL REMINDERS practice regulations

IN-SEASON: School is In-Session

## **Eight Hour Rule**

- Practice outside the school day during the school week (excluding holidays) is limited to a maximum of 8 hours per activity.
- The athletic period does not count towards the 8 hours.



# TEAM SPORTS PRACTICE REGULATIONS

### OFF-SEASON: School is In-Session


### **Strength & Conditioning Instruction**

- Teams in off-season are allowed 1 hour of S&C instruction outside the school day.
- Athletes may only attend one, 1-hour session per day, Monday-Friday
- No skill instruction or equipment is allowed
- Skill Instruction is ONLY allowed during the athletic period for off-season team sports.



# SCRIMMAGES

- Saturday, January 24th first day
- No more than 4 teams
- · Cannot count as a game for any team
- Limit of 2 per calendar week
- Only 1 can be during school week
- No scrimmages after first game
- If more than 4 teams, each team may only scrimmage 3 other teams



# ALLOWABLE CONTESTS

- 3 Tournaments and 17 Games
- · 2 Tournaments and 20 Games or
- 1 Tournament and 23 Games or
- 0 Tournaments and 26 Games

3 games may be substituted for a tournament





# SOFTBALL CONTEST REGULATIONS

CALENDAR & SCHOOL WEEK VERY IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THE DIFFERENCE! Games Allowed per SCHOOL Week:

 A team or individual player may only play one game during the school week.

Games Allowed per <u>CALENDAR</u> Week:

UNLIMITED




# SOFTBALL CONTEST REGULATIONS

Games Allowed per School Week:

- EXCEPTIONS: TOURNAMENTS, POST-SEASON, & VARSITY DISTRICT GAMES POSTPONED BY WEATHER.
- IMPORTANT: Varsity district games postponed by weather which are not played on the next available date may NOT be made up as an exception to the school week limitation.

# DOUBLE HEADER

- Double Header A player plays in 2
   varsity games back-to-back or in a
   varsity & junior varsity game at the
   same site on the same night.
- Each game counts as I of the student's total games for the season.
- A double header can be played once during the school week & once after the end of the school week (games unlimited for the calendar week).
