

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

HOMESCHOOL STUDENT PARTICIPATION:

- All homeschool students are eligible to participate in UIL activities, practices and processes unless their local school district has opted out of the law.
- If the local district has opted out, student would be eligible at nearest school that allows participation to their address.
- School districts that do allow participation can elect to not allow students from other districts to participate.



WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

NIL:

- UIL rules now allow student-athletes 17 years or older to enter into NIL agreements with colleges & universities while participating in that UIL sport.
- Athletes are still prohibited from entering into NIL agreements with any other entity until exhausting their eligibility in that applicable sport.
- Athletes are still prohibited from promoting a product or service related to their UIL sport.
- UIL rules do not prohibit an athlete from obtaining professional representation.



ELIGIBILITY PAPF REQUIREMENT

(PREVIOUS ATHLETIC PARTICIPATION FORM)

The UIL Legislative Council approved a change to Section 443 of the UIL C&CR

The completion of the Page 1 of the PAPF in the UIL portal is now REQUIRED prior to participation at ANY level at a new school.

It is <u>recommended</u> that coaches send the PAPF to the previous school once page 1 is completed.

Allowable Contests & Match Regulations

Number of Contests allowed (2025-26)

Dual Match.

- In a dual match, a team plays two other teams or plays the same team twice (same competition level). At the same site, the same day.
- A dual match counts one of the two matches UIL permits students per calendar week and counts as two of the total matches for the student per season.
- Example: A team could play a dual match (two varsity matches) on Tuesday and then again on Friday, in addition to a tournament on Thursday-Saturday or Friday-Saturday.

Rally Scoring Regulations. 💫



Double Header.

- In a double header a student may play in a varsity and a junior varsity match (or a ninth grade and a varsity match) at the same site the same night.
- · A double header counts as the two allowable matches UIL permits the student for the calendar week and counts as two of the total matches for the season.

WHAT'S NEW FOR 2025-2026

State semifinals sites have been predetermined and will be held the weekend prior to the state championships.



FOCUS ON PRESEASON AND IN-SEASON ELIGIBILITY PROCESSES

- 2 coaches verify all eligibility processes
- PAPF's for all students that require one completed prior to first contest at any level of play
- Factually complete PAPF when sending school
- Appropriate verification of residence (Section 442) & contact previous school



CONTINUED FOCUS ON APPROPRIATE ETHICS AND ACCOUNTABILITY

- Removal of situational ethics
- Willingness to act and be responsible when necessary (Do your part)
- Power of a positive example (Be what you expect others to be)



EMERGENCY RESPONSE READINESS (EFFECTIVE EAP'S)

- All EAP's reviewed for all athletic facilities
- Regular rehearsal of EAP by staff and students
- Establish a process for a pregame medical timeout with admin, officials, coaches, & trainers

SPORTSMANSHIP

PLAYER EJECTIONS

- Ejected volleyball players miss the rest of the game in which they were ejected plus all the following game.
- Player ejections *cannot* be overturned by a game official and/or chapter.
- If a coach has a question following a contest with a player ejection, the coach should contact UIL.







NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION COACHES' REMINDERS

It is important for coaches to have a clear understanding of Section 1201, 1206 and 1209 of the C&CR regarding non-school competition (leagues, camps, clinics, clubs, tournaments). Coaches are PROHIBITED from:

- 1. Coaching students from their attendance zone in grades 7-12. Coaches may not coach seniors in club following the end of their senior season during the remainder of the school year.
- 2.Using school or booster funds to pay for team camps.
- 3.Pressuring athletes to play club volleyball or in non-school leagues. This includes pushing athletes to participate on a specific club team.

NON-SCHOOL PARTICIPATION

COACHES' REMINDERS

Section 1209 of the C&CR regarding non-school competition (leagues, camps, clinics, clubs, tournaments) ALLOWS the following for coaches or a group of coaches:

1. Supervise the facility where a club team is practicing or a league is taking place.

2.Assist with organization of a league or club team. (assign officials, secure facilities, develop schedules, assist with registration and help secure equipment)

3. Assist with the selection of coaches and players for a club team or league.

4. Distribute information about leagues and club teams.

COACHES' REMINDERS

UIL CHARITABLE CAUSE GUIDELINES
SCHOOLS MAY HOST A CONTEST IN RECOGNITION OF A
CHARITABLE CAUSE UNDER THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- The contest may be held during any one week of the designated sport season as approved by each school.
- NFHS rules allow non-school colors to be worn, UIL required mutual agreement. (ex: pink uniforms)
- A commemorative ribbon of non-school color may be worn on the jersey or school-issued uniform.
- Officials may be allowed to use a colored whistle or modified uniform in accordance with UIL guidelines.
- Colored game balls will not be allowed, however they
 may be used during any warm-up period prior to the
 contest.




VOLLEYBALL RULE BOOK

The Volleyball playing rules are <u>not</u> UIL rules.

UIL volleyball will follow NFHS rules. it is important to review the NFHS Volleyball Rules prior to the season.





3-2-1 NOTE (NEW): BEGINNING WITH THE 2026-27 SCHOOL YEAR, STATE ASSOCIATIONS MAY ADOPT THE USE OF A NON-SMOOTH OR TEXTURED VOLLEYBALL.

RATIONALE: ALLOWS EITHER BOYS OR GIRLS TO ADOPT A TEXTURED VOLLEYBALL WITH NO RESTRICTIONS ON COLOR OR SHAPE OF PANELS TO BE INCLUSIVE OF ALL CURRENT TEXTURED VOLLEYBALLS ON THE MARKET.

4-2-1H(3), 4-2-11(2): TEAM MEMBERS MAY WEAR BLACK, WHITE OR GRAY UNDERGARMENTS IN ADDITION TO UNDERGARMENTS THAT MATCH THE PREDOMINANT COLOR OF THE UNIFORM TOP/BOTTOM UNDER THE UNIFORM TOP AND/OR BOTTOM. ALL TEAM MEMBERS, OTHER THAN THE LIBERO, WEARING AN UNDERGARMENT MUST WEAR THE SAME COLOR.

RATIONALE: ALIGNS WITH OTHER NFHS RULES CODES ALLOWING ATHLETES TO WEAR MORE COMMONLY FOUND COLORS OF UNDERGARMENTS.



4-2-4D, F: BEGINNING JULY 1, 2029, THE NUMBER ON THE FRONT OF THE UNIFORM MUST BE CENTERED ON THE UPPER HALF OF THE UNIFORM TOP ELIMINATING THE MEASUREMENT REQUIREMENTS FROM THE SHOULDER SEAM AND NECKLINE.

RATIONALE: REMOVES OFFICIALS FROM THE POSITION OF MEASURING UNIFORMS TO VERIFY THE LEGAL DISTANCE OF THE NUMBER FROM THE SHOULDER OR NECKLINE, CREATES CONSISTENCY IN NUMBER PLACEMENT, AND ALLOWS FOR NUMBER PLACEMENT VARIANCES DUE TO PLAYER BODY TYPES.

5-3-2B, 5-5-3B(9): ELIMINATES THE REQUIREMENT FOR THE SECOND REFEREE TO CARRY AND USE A LINEUP CARD TO CHECK THE STARTING LINEUPS.

RATIONALE: ALLOWS VETERAN OFFICIALS TO USE EACH COACH'S SUBMITTED LINEUP SHEET TO CHECK THE STARTING LINEUP WHILE ALLOWING THE USE OF THE LINEUP CARD AS A TRAINING TOOL FOR NEWER OFFICIALS TO ASSIST WITH TRACKING ROTATIONS DURING THE MATCH.



9-4-8C (NEW): ELIMINATES THE JUDGMENT CALL OF A MULTIPLE CONTACT FAULT IN A SINGLE ATTEMPT TO PLAY THE BALL ON THE SECOND TEAM HIT IF THE BALL IS NEXT CONTACTED BY A TEAMMATE.

RATIONALE: ALLOWS FOR PLAY TO CONTINUE WHEN MULTIPLE CONTACTS ON THE SECOND CONTACT DOES NOT CREATE AN ADVANTAGE FOR THE OFFENDING TEAM. JANUARY 31, 2025 PAGE NO.

2 10-4 PENALTIES 1: CHANGES THE PENALTY ADMINISTRATION FOR AN ILLEGAL LIBERO REPLACEMENT TO AN UNNECESSARY DELAY IF IDENTIFIED BEFORE CONTACT OF SERVE AND AN ILLEGAL ALIGNMENT IF IDENTIFIED AFTER CONTACT FOR SERVE.

RATIONALE: ALIGNS THE PENALTY FOR AN ILLEGAL LIBERO REPLACEMENT WITH THE DEFINITION OF ILLEGAL ALIGNMENT WHICH OCCURS ON CONTACT OF SERVE.

VOLLEYBALL REMINDERS practice regulations

IN-SEASON: Outside the School Year

- 1 Practice Cannot exceed 3 hours
- 2 Practices Cannot exceed 5 hours
 - 3 hours is max for a single practice
 - More than 1 practice scheduled, must have a minimum of 2-hour rest break

Unlike other sports, volleyball can schedule more than one practice on consecutive days. Volleyball is the only exception.



VOLLEYBALL REMINDERS practice regulations

IN-SEASON: School is In-Session

Eight Hour Rule

Practice outside the school day, from the beginning of the school week through the end of the school week (excluding holidays), is limited to a maximum of eight hours per school week per activity

The in-school athletic period does not count towards the allotted 8 hours



TEAM SPORTS practice regulations

OFF-SEASON: School is In-Session

Strength & Conditioning Instruction

Teams in the off-season are allowed one hour of strength & conditioning instruction outside of the school day.

- Athletes may only attend one, 1-hour session each day, Monday-Friday.
- No skill instruction or equipment is allowed during this hour of S&C instruction.

Skill Instruction is only allowed during the athletic period for offseason team sports.



SCRIMMAGES

- No scrimmages may be played after a team's first interschool game.
- If more than four teams are invited to a scrimmage, each team may only scrimmage three different teams.

2 matches may be substituted for a tournament

DUAL

MATCH

- A team plays 2 matches back-toback at the same competition level
- Counts as two matches in allowable season limit, counts as only one contest for calendar week.
- Dual matches can be played in addition to tournaments in a calendar week.




DUAL MATCH

Dual Match Example

- A varsity team could play a dual match on Tuesday, a second dual match on Friday, and a tournament on Thursday/Saturday.
- This would count as I contest during the school week, 2 contests and a tournament for the calendar week.

DOUBLE HEADER

- A player plays in two matches at two levels on the same night (9th & JV, JV & Varsity)
- A double header counts as two matches in the calendar week for that athlete.





DOUBLE HEADER

Example: (following the first 2 weeks of season)

- Athlete plays a double header on Tuesday night, they cannot play again in that calendar week (M-Sa)
- If an athlete plays in a JV game on Tuesday, that player may not play a double header (JV & Varsity game) on Friday. Should an athlete play in 3 matches in a calendar week, the team would be required to forfeit the third game the athlete participated in.
