



Kay Yow Foundation Becomes Charity of Choice for the Texas Girls Coaches Association

The Board of Directors of the Texas Girls Coaches Association voted to name the Kay Yow Foundation as the official charity of choice at the June 6, 2010, meeting in Austin, Texas. Marsha Sharp, Executive Director of the Kay Yow Foundation, solicited the support of TGCA to become a nationwide player with the Foundation in finding answers in the fight against women's cancers through raising money for scientific research, assisting the underserved and unifying people for a common cause. There are several coaches currently fighting the vicious disease of cancer. Coaches of women athletics share not only their profession, but a community, and it is important to pull together and support a cause. TGCA will join with the Kay Yow Foundation in challenging member coaches, institutions, fans and communities to implement one Event-in-a-Box, as provided by the Foundation, to raise money for the Cancer Fund.

The Kay Yow Foundation works in partnership with The V Foundation for Cancer Research. The V Foundation was founded by ESPN and Jimmy Valvano 14 years ago. Jimmy V had a quest to eradicate cancer with a dire need for early development detection, critical-stage grant support, and his Foundation was formed to assist the brilliant young researchers to eventually find cures for cancer development.
